

## INTERNAL MEDICINE-PEDIATRICS

### **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

Students will be able to:

1. Demonstrate proficiency in documenting a relevant history and physical for adult and pediatric patients seen in ambulatory clinics.
2. Demonstrate comprehension of current strategies for patient management in various specialties of Medicine and Pediatrics as evidenced through case discussions and chart reviews in clinics as assigned.

### **SUPERVISION:**

80% Faculty

20% Fellows

### **DESCRIPTION:**

Under close supervision by the staff and residents of the service, patients are evaluated in the admitting area and walk-in clinic. Experience is gained in diagnosis, treatment and disposition of many emergency psychiatric problems. The student is also expected to participate in departmental and divisional conferences and seminars. Daily schedule is flexible and to be arranged with preceptor. There is no fixed weekly schedule, but students are expected to be available during working hours.

### **EVALUATION:**

Students will be informed of expectations and methods of evaluation during orientation at beginning of rotation. Student's performance is assessed by supervising attending or fellow based on their participation in clinical activities (50%), attendance in all assigned clinics/rounds (25%), and their final presentation (25%). Ongoing feedback will be given after each patient encounter.
